**Little Paleontologists** – Students will see examples of various types of fossils, such as footprints, teeth, and bones. They will also dig for fossils, make some of their own, build a dinosaur skeleton, and learn about many types of prehistoric animals.

**The Animal Kingdom** – Animals can be classified into many different types. Choose a five session series to learn about mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, and fish. Add extra sessions for insects, mollusks, crustaceans, and more! All sessions include artifacts, activities, crafts, and of course, lots of animals!

**Animals Around the World** – In this class we will learn all about animals and their native continents. While we meet these amazing creatures we'll discover what adaptations they have to live where they do.

**Drawing** – Drawing is the foundation of (and bridge between) many artists and artworks. In this program, we will use variety of drawing media, such as pencil, charcoal, and pastel. We will also explore different genres of drawing, such as landscape, still life, and portrait.

**Painting** – Painting is one of the most popular, and prolific, types of visual art. In this program, we will look at how various artists have used paint to communicate their ideas, thoughts, and feelings. We will also learn how to handle painting tools, mix colors, and apply different kinds of paints.

**Sculpture** – Art doesn't have to be two-dimensional. Sculptors use materials like limestone, marble, clay, bronze, plaster, wood, fabric, and recycled materials to create extraordinary works of art. In this program, we will look at how sculpture has changed over the centuries and be inspired to create our own three-dimensional art.
